On June 12, 2015, Integrys Energy Group, Inc. posted the following announcement to the Integrys internal transaction website:

Minnesota commission votes to approve Integrys acquisition

The Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) today voted to approve Wisconsin Energy Corporation's proposed acquisition of Integrys Energy Group Inc. A final written order is expected in the next several weeks. Today's vote represents another positive and important step in the process of finalizing the acquisition of Integrys.

The acquisition was previously approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) on April 7, Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC) on April 23, and Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) on May 21.

The Administrative Law Judge's proposed order in Illinois recommends approval of the acquisition and still appears to be on track for an Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) vote on or before the statutory deadline of July 6.

If all regulatory approvals are received, close of the transaction is anticipated by the end of the summer.

In connection with the proposed merger transaction between Wisconsin Energy Corporation ("Wisconsin Energy") and Integrys Energy Group, Inc. ("Integrys"), Wisconsin Energy filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC") a registration statement on Form S-4 that includes a joint proxy statement/prospectus for the shareholders of Wisconsin Energy and Integrys. The registration statement was declared effective by the SEC on October 6, 2014. Each of Wisconsin Energy and Integrys mailed the joint proxy statement/prospectus to their respective shareholders on or around October 21, 2014 and filed other documents regarding the proposed merger transaction with the SEC. Integrys urges investors and shareholders to read the joint proxy statement/prospectus, as well as other documents filed with the SEC, because they contain important information.
